

Wayfinders Plus Housing Program

Income Eligibility & Other Requirements

In order to qualify for the Wayfinders Plus Housing Program, an applicant must:

- Be a single parent with primary custody of children under the age of 18.
- Be currently enrolled full-time in a two- or four-year degree program.
- Have at least one year of study remaining in their two-/four-year degree program.
- Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or greater.
- Meet the income eligibility requirements for the City of Pittsburgh's Housing Choice Voucher Program as listed below:

[Per City of Pittsburgh requirements](#), applicants may be determined ineligible for the Wayfinders Plus Housing Program if any of the following applies:

- The applicant's annual income exceeds the maximum limits listed above.
- The applicant has an outstanding balance due under the law to any public housing authority or a private landlord. An owing balance includes unpaid rent, maintenance charges, and legal costs.
- The applicant has a criminal history of drug possession and/or sales, disorderly conduct, physical violence and/or other criminal activity, which would adversely affect the health, safety, or welfare of other residents.

Please note: If your application is rejected or withdrawn for any reason, you will be given notice of an opportunity to dispute this decision at an informal hearing.
